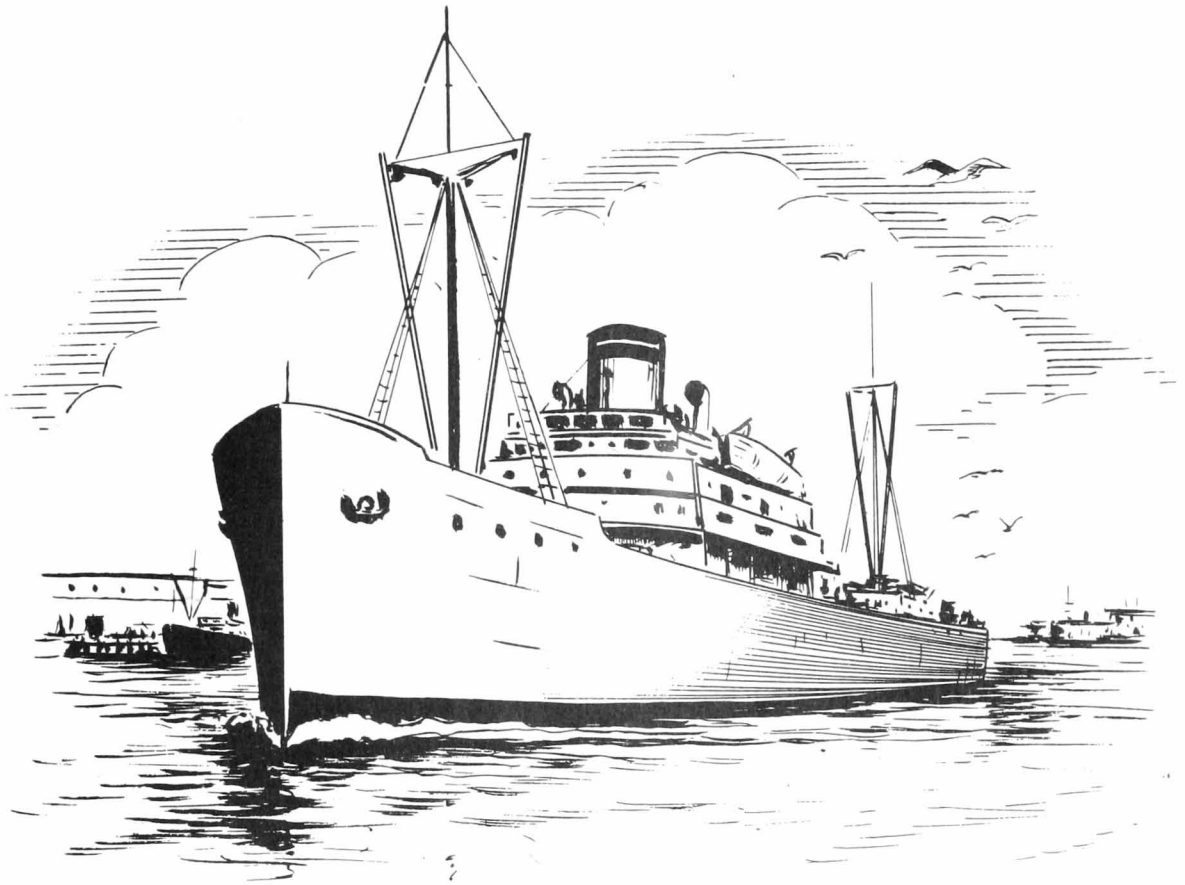

U. S. IMPORT CLASSIFICATION AND DUTIES OF FISHERY AND WILDLIFE COMMODITIES

A summary of selected items from Schedule A, Statistical Classification of Commodities Imported into the United States (published by the Bureau of the Census), covering commodity classifications applying mainly to fisheries and wildlife imported into the United States, including rates of duty and tariff paragraphs.

FOREWORD

Purpose and Use of Fishery Leaflet No. 417

This leaflet has been prepared to provide ready reference to Schedule A, Statistical Classification of Commodities Imported into the United States, code classifications, tariff paragraphs, and rates of duties of commodities derived from fisheries and wildlife or of particular use to fisheries and wildlife. The text and the tabular material which follow are selected items pertaining to fisheries, wildlife, and related commodities which have been excerpted from Schedule A.

This leaflet should not be deemed authority for determining the proper classification for any imported article. Questions relating to import classifications should be referred to the Foreign Trade Division, Bureau of Census, Washington 25, D. C.

An alphabetic index has been prepared from that contained in Schedule A to facilitate reference to the particular classifications included in this leaflet. The index should be used solely for purposes of reference to the Schedule A classifications and descriptions presented in this leaflet.

Schedule A

Schedule A is the statistical classification of all commodities imported into the United States used in compiling the official United States import statistics. It shows for each commodity description the designated commodity code numbers to be shown on import entries and withdrawal forms. In addition, it shows code classifications for countries, customs districts and ports, subgroups, economic classes, units of quantity, and flag of vessel registry classifications used in compiling the statistics of import. Schedule A is a publication of the U.S. Department of Commerce, prepared by the Bureau of Census, Foreign Trade Division.

Copies of the complete Schedule A, including Code Classification for Countries (Schedule C), United States Customs Districts and Ports (Schedule D), and Flag of Vessel Registry (Schedule J) may be obtained from the Superintendent of Documents, U.S. Government Printing Office, Field Offices of the Department of Commerce, and Collectors of Customs, for \$3.50 to Domestic Subscribers and \$4.50 to Foreign Subscribers. Copies of Schedule A are available for reference in the Field Offices of the Department of Commerce or the Bureau of Customs.

Import Duties as Mentioned in this Leaflet

This leaflet, as with Schedule A from which it was derived, was prepared solely for statistical purposes and is not deemed authority for deciding the rate of duty properly chargeable upon any specific, imported article. Questions relating to the classification of commodities for duty purposes should be referred to the Collector of Customs located at the United States port of entry.

How Revisions Will Be Made

Announcements of revisions in Schedule A covering commodities included in this leaflet (which appear in Public Bulletins of the Bureau of Census) will be published in the Service's Daily Market News Reports and in the Commercial Fisheries Review.

Changes in Classifications and Duty Rates since January 1, 1954

This leaflet has been revised to incorporate changes made in the January 1, 1954 Edition of Schedule A as reported in Public Bulletins A-1 through and including A-9, issued by the Bureau of the Census.

The principal changes involve classifications and modified rates of duty required or appropriate to carry out the terms of accession by Japan to the General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade (GATT) and changes in duties as provided for by Public Law 689 of August 28, 1954 and compensatory concessions. Included in this revision are new classifications and modified rates of duty necessary to carry out the tariff concessions granted at Geneva in negotiations under the GATT, January-May 1956, as defined in the President's Proclamation of June 13, 1956.

Rates of duty relating to the Japanese accession to the GATT effective on or after September 10, 1955 (T. D. 53865 and T. D. 53877) are identified by the superior notation "q⁶" against the rates in the fifth column of the page. Changes in classification and compensatory concession rates of duty resulting from the provisions of Public Law 689 and effective on and after July 21, 1955 by President's Proclamation 3105 (T. D. 53865) are identified by the superior notation "q⁷". Changes resulting from the Geneva negotiations in 1956 were effective on and after June 30, 1956 and may be identified by a superior notation "r⁶" against the rates of duty in the fifth column of the page. Changes effective on and after June 30, 1957 may be identified by notation "s⁶". Changes to become effective June 30, 1958 are shown on inside of front cover.

The Basis of the Present Tariff

The Tariff Act of 1930, which became effective on June 18, 1930, is the latest general tariff revision undertaken by the United States Congress. Many of the rates specified in the Tariff Act of 1930 have been changed by statutory amendments or by Presidential proclamation. The Tariff Act, as modified and amended, is published in UNITED STATES IMPORT DUTIES (1952), issued by the United States Tariff Commission. This publication shows the individual tariff paragraphs and the special administrative provisions of the Act. Copies of the publication may be purchased from the Superintendent of Documents, U. S. Government Printing Office, Washington 25, D. C., for \$3.25 to Domestic Subscribers, and \$4.25 to Foreign Subscribers.

SUMMARY OF FOREIGN COMMERCE STATISTICAL REGULATIONS¹

This schedule exhibits the statistical classifications of commodity imports into the United States required by section 484(e) of the Tariff Act of 1930 and contains the Schedule A numbers and commodity descriptions required to be shown on the import entries and withdrawals prepared by the importer or his agent. Unless otherwise specified import entries and withdrawals refer to entries for consumption, entries for warehouse, withdrawals for consumption, and withdrawals for exportation.

STATISTICAL REGULATIONS TO BE FOLLOWED BY IMPORTERS

The statistical regulations to be followed by importers in the preparation and filing of import entries and withdrawals are as follows (for detailed requirements see Foreign Commerce Statistical Regulations, F. T. circular letters, etc.):

(a) The kinds, quantities, and values of all imported articles shall be shown on all import entries and withdrawals. Collectors of Customs shall require entries of imported merchandise to contain the information required in Schedule A.

(b) The Schedule A commodity code numbers shall be shown on all import entries and withdrawals.

(c) Quantities shall be reported in the units of quantity shown in the column headed "Unit of quantity." Quantities should be reported in net weights, unless otherwise indicated. Quantities shall be shown in whole units unless fractions of units are required for duty purposes.

(d) The values of imported merchandise will be returned in the statistical reports in accordance with the values as defined in section 402 of the Tariff Act. The value of the usual containers or coverings and other charges or expenses incident to placing the merchandise in condition packed ready for shipment to the United States, should be included in the statistical value of merchandise, whether the merchandise is dutiable or free of duty. For statistical purposes nondutiable charges should be deducted in entries from total invoice values for imported merchandise free of duty, as well as for merchandise subject to duty at specific or ad valorem rates.

(e) Shipping weight of all imported articles shall be shown on all consumption and warehouse entries filed for importation by vessel and air. Shipping weight data

are not required to be shown on withdrawals for consumption and on warehouse and consumption entries for merchandise imported other than by vessel and air, i.e. rail, truck, etc.

(f) The country of origin of all imported articles shall be shown on all entries and withdrawals. By country of origin is meant the country of production or manufacture of the imported merchandise. Further labor, work, or material added to an article in another country must effect a substantial transformation in order to render such other country the "country of origin." Such substantial transformations include: smelting of ores; milling or refining of crude products; tanning of hides; weaving of yarns; bleaching, printing, or dyeing of textile fabrics; conversion of metal into a machine or appliance; cutting of stones; and the like. The country of origin is not changed when the merchandise is subjected in another country merely to minor manipulations, such as sorting, grading, screening, cleaning, packaging, repackaging, and the like. In cases in which the merchandise is invoiced in or exported from a country other than the country of origin, care should be taken to insure that the country of origin is correctly specified.

(g) The nationality and motive power of the vessel from which imported articles are landed in the United States shall be shown on all import entries and withdrawals covering importations by vessel.

(h) The applicable Tariff Paragraph, section of the Tariff Act, or section of the Internal Revenue Code shall be indicated on entries and withdrawals for all imported articles, including articles imported under Special Provisions.

COVERAGE UNDER SCHEDULE A

Types of imports classified in accordance with Schedule A

- 1 Entered for immediate consumption.
- 2 Withdrawal from bonded storage warehouse for consumption, withdrawal from bonded smelting and refining warehouse for consumption or for export, and transfer from bonded storage warehouse to bonded manufacturing warehouse for manufacturing and export.
- 3 Entered for bonded storage warehouse, and entered for bonded smelting and refining warehouse.
- 4 Withdrawn from bonded storage warehouse for exportation.
- 5 Entered for bonded manufacturing warehouse for manufacture and export (direct entry only).

Imports are compiled as imports for consumption and general imports. Imports for consumption represent merchandise entering into domestic consumption channels (types 1, 2, and 5 above). General imports include all merchandise arriving in the United States, other than direct intransit merchandise (types 1, 3, and 5 above).

A complete discussion of the compilation procedures and coverage for import statistics will be found in the Foreword to *Foreign Commerce and Navigation of the United States*. Copies of the Foreword are obtainable upon request.

REFERENCES FOR INTERPRETING SPECIAL NOTATIONS, ABBREVIATIONS, AND SYMBOLS USED THROUGHOUT SCHEDULE A

Superior Notations Against Classification Numbers and Units of Quantity

The superior letters "a" to "p" following a class number indicate the year in which the class was established as follows:

The numerals 1 to 12 following the superior letters indicate the month of the year in which the change was effective; e.g., a change effective February 1940 would be indicated as "b2".

The single asterisk (*) following a class number indicates that this classification was *reestablished*. The letter and number following the asterisk indicate the year and month, as above.

The double asterisk (**) following a class number indicates that this classification was *renumbered*. The letter and number following the asterisk indicate the year and month, as above.

In the case where a commodity is reported in a double unit of quantity, a superior "v" against one of the units indicates that the value is reported with this unit. (In numeric code tabulations quantities reported with values are shown with "unit control" code "0", and quantities reported without values are shown with "unit control" code "2".)

Superior Notations Against Rates of Duty

Rates of duty included in an operative trade agreement other than the General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade are followed by the abbreviation of the country with which the agreement was made. Rates of duty included in the General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade (GATT) which are applicable to products of Cuba only are followed by "Cuba GATT." Rates of duty included only in the General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade, and not applicable to products of Cuba only, are not followed by any abbreviation. The month and year in which rates of duty included in the General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade became effective are indicated by superior letters and numbers except that no symbols are shown for such rates which became effective January 1, 1948. The single asterisk (*) following a rate of duty indicates that the rate is included in the General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade and was effective

on different dates for different components of the Schedule A classification.

The trade agreement with Sweden effective August 5, 1935, was terminated June 30, 1950, two months after concessions resulting from negotiations with Sweden under GATT became effective.

This schedule shows the free or dutiable status under a trade agreement only if the agreement is currently operative.

of the countries listed under the General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade, including those shown with a particular country or countries, are applicable to commodities, the growth, produce, or manufacture of all foreign countries with the following exceptions (T.D. 50650 and T.D. 51802):

(a) The rates shown with Cuba GATT are applicable only to commodities, the growth, produce or manufacture of Cuba (T.D. 51819).

(b) Commodities, the growth, produce or manufacture of the Philippines are entered in accordance with Public Law 328-894 Congress (T.D. 53985), Philippine Trade Agreement Executive Act of 1952 effective January 1, 1953.

(c) Reduced rates of duty or import taxes established pursuant to any trade agreement are not applicable to articles, the growth, produce, or manufacture of any of the nations or areas specified on next page.

(d) The importation of certain furs and skins which are the product of any part of China which is under Communist domination or control or of the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics is prohibited effective September 1, 1951 (T.D. 52782), January 5, 1952 (T.D. 52877) and February 19, 1952 (T.D. 53191), respectively.
