

THE ECONOMIC COOPERATION ADMINISTRATION AND THE FISHERY INDUSTRIES

Information on the proposed trade in edible fishery products under the European Recovery Program has been released by the House of Representatives Appropriations Committee. This information is contained in three books referred to as "Three Volumes of European Recovery Program Brown Books."<sup>1/</sup>

The first book is entitled "Proposed Distribution of Economic Cooperation Act Financing by Country and Commodity."

From the upper part of this table it can be seen that in the 15 months' period from April 1, 1948 to June 30, 1949 the Economic Cooperation Administration will finance shipments of fish and fishery products worth 53.3 million dollars from the Western Hemisphere to the sixteen countries participating in the European Recovery Program. This is the dollar amount which will be paid from Economic Cooperation Administration funds. The total amount for shipments of fish and fishery products is expected to be 76.3 million dollars during the same period. Of this amount, in addition to the 53.3 million dollars to be financed by ECA, 18.9 million dollars worth of shipments will be paid for by dollar exchange held by participants, while the remaining shipments amounting to 4.1 million dollars will have to be financed by other means, probably by their exports to dollar areas.

A second book is entitled "Estimated Balance of Payments on Current Account of the Participating Countries." The reference to "Fish" follows:

This table indicates that during the 15 months' period from April 1, 1948 to June 30, 1949 the sixteen countries participating in the Program will import fish and fishery products valued at 240.7 million dollars. Of this amount, shipments worth 76.3 million dollars will come from the Western Hemisphere, including 51.8 million dollars worth from the United States.

The third book entitled "Estimated Commodity Imports and Exports of the Participating Countries by Value and Quantity" contains 8 tables, which are attached as appendices 1 - 8.

These tables show the quantities and values of imports and exports of the participating countries. Data for the two periods (a) April to June, 1948, (b) Fiscal year 1948 - 1949 are shown separately.

In the following table, the proposed distribution of ECA funds for purchase of Western Hemisphere edible fishery products is combined for both periods mentioned in the appendices comprising the 15 months from April 1, 1948 to June 30, 1949.

According to the appendices, the United Kingdom will get the bulk of fishery imports, while the exports will come mainly from Norway and Iceland. The information does not go into the details of the composition of the imports or exports. However, because the European Recovery Program will not change traditional export and import interrelations, it can be expected that approximately the same species and the same products will be imported or exported as in prewar times.

Summarizing, it should be said that for the fiscal year 1948 - 1949 the United States is expected to export 46,000 metric tons of edible fishery products to participants in ERP, as against receiving 36,000 metric tons of imports from them. The value of the United States' exports for the fiscal year is estimated to be 41.5 million dollars.

The publications emphasize that all figures given are not rigid and may be altered with changing conditions.

So far as exports are concerned, trade will be conducted as far as possible through normal commercial channels. After an intended commercial transaction has been arranged with the foreign importer, the transaction must be authorized by the Economic Cooperation Administration, which then will provide the finances to the respective foreign government. The Commodity Credit Corporation and the Federal Procurement Agencies, also, may sell fish and fishery products to foreign importers, in which case the Corporation or Agency also must follow the procedure outlined above.

In general, the industries were advised to go ahead with private selling plans. Firms may either accept orders in foreign countries, on the condition that transactions have to be approved by the ECA, or they may sell to exporting firms within this Country under the same condition. The firm which actually exports has to obtain the approval of ECA. In addition, every exporting firm must have an export license issued by the Office of the International Trade of the Department of Commerce. However, if ECA has approved the sale, according to information received, the export license will be obtained easily. In cases where American firms sell goods to a foreign country with a clause in the contract requiring delivery in a foreign country, it is advisable to make certain that the foreign country will permit the imports. If the exporting firm does not want to undergo the often difficult procedure of obtaining the foreign import license, it is advised to sell "F.O.B. American Port," purchase price to be paid after the American documents are cleared and products are in the hands of the shipping company.

It should be mentioned that an emergency purchasing program has already been enacted for Italy and that the main regular programs affecting, principally, the United Kingdom will be underway very soon.
