<u>Duties</u> (1950), bringing that publication up to date. Supplement II showed certain changes in duties resulting from the trade-agreement negotiations conducted at Torquay, England. Since Supplement II was issued, most of the remainder of the tariff concessions negotiated at Torquay have been put into effect. Also certain additional concessions initially negotiated with

China at the 1947 Geneva trade conference have been withdrawn. Changes in duties resulting from these and other actions are indicated in this Supplement III. Some of the changes affect fishery products imports. Plans are in progress for the issuance in about six months of a new edition of the basic document.
