INTRODUCTION

This index describes the publications of the Fish and Wildlife Service issued in 1955 and 1956 and those of the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service issued in 1957-64.

The President's Reorganization Plan No. 3 established the Fish and Wildlife Service June 30, 1940, by consolidation of the Bureau of Fisheries and the Bureau of Biological Survey. The Fish and Wildlife Act of 1956 established the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, which comprises the Bureau of Commercial Fisheries and the Bureau of Sport Fisheries and Wildlife. The chief purposes of the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service are to establish a sound and comprehensive national policy with respect to fish and wildlife and to strengthen the fish and wildlife segments of the national economy.

The index comprises a serial list of the numbers issued in each publication series (numbers that do not pertain to fisheries are omitted) and alphabetical indexes of authors and subjects. In the author index and in the subject index, the references are to numbers in the series lists.

This index does not list two Bureau of Commercial Fisheries periodicals--Commercial Fisheries Abstracts and Commercial Fisheries Review--and one Bureau of Sport Fisheries and Wildlife periodical--Sport Fishery Abstracts. These three periodicals have their own indexing systems.

Fish and Wildlife Price List 21 of the Superintendent of Documents, U.S. Government Printing Office, Washington, D.C. 20402, gives information on availability of sales items.

PUBLICATION SERIES DESCRIPTION

A description of the series of publications follows. The period covered by each series is shown, absence of a second year means the series is still active.

Circular (1941-)

Popular and semitechnical publications of general and regional interest intended to aid conservation and management. They are distributed free to libraries, research institutions both in this country and in foreign countries, Federal and State agencies, and scientists.

Current Fishery Statistics (1941-)

Current statistical information on fishery production, manufacture, and domestic or foreign trade; issued monthly, quarterly, or annually by States, regions or larger areas. The Current Fishery Statistical publications are sent to private and Government industries in the United States, foreign industries, and United States embassies.

Data Report (1964-)

Reports that include compilations of unanalyzed or partially analyzed data collected during biological, limnological, or oceanographic investigations. The reports are printed as 3- by 5-inch microfiches, each of which has up to 40 pages of material. The pages are reduced to one-eighteenth normal size; consequently, they can be read only through a microscope, microfiche "reader," or any similar device for enlarging. They are distributed free to a restricted mailing list of laboratories, libraries, State fishery agencies, research institutions, and research scientists. Fishery and Oceanography Translations (1964-)

Subject-indexed lists of translations that are available to fishery scientists and oceanographers; translations that are in progress; translated tables of contents of important foreign and oceanographic journals; and abstracts of pertinent foreign scientific literature. Limited distribution is made to laboratories, libraries, State fishery agencies, research institutions, and research scientists.

Fishery Bulletin (1931-

Technical reports on scientific investigations of fishery biology. The Bulletin of the United States Fish Commission was begun in 1881; it became the Bulletin of the Bureau of Fisheries in 1904 and the Fishery Bulletin of the Fish and Wildlife Service in 1941. Separates were

issued as documents through volume 46; the last document was No. 1103. Beginning with volume 47 in 1931 and continuing through volume 62 in 1963, each separate appeared as a numbered Bulletin. A new system began in 1963 with volume 63 in which papers are bound together in a single issue of the Bulletin instead of being issued only as individual papers. Bulletins are distributed free to libraries, research institutions, State agencies, and scientists. Some Bulletins are for sale by the Superintendent of Documents, U.S. Government Printing Office, Washington, D.C. 20402.

Fishery Industrial Research (1963-)

Technical reports dealing with scientific investigations of fishery technology, economics, exploratory fishing, and gear research. They are distributed free to libraries, fishing industry, scientists, and technologists.

Fishery Leaflet (1941-)

Popular information on fishery subjects intended primarily for use in correspondence. They are distributed free to Federal and State agencies and scientists, libraries, and U.S. and foreign research institutions.

North American Fauna (1889-)

This series, begun by the U.S. Department of Agriculture's Bureau of Biological Survey, comprises technical reports of fundamental scientific investigations of primary interest to naturalists and researchers, relating to the biology of mammals, birds, reptiles, and amphibians. These reports include monographs and reports of regional biological surveys; studies of distribution, migration, life history, and ecology; contributions to the theory and methodology of research and papers on the scientific basis of natural resource management. This series is distributed to depository libraries. The Fish and Wildlife Service distributes copies without charge to official agencies, libraries, and researchers in fields related to the Service's work. Additional copies may be purchased from the Superintendent of Documents, U.S. Government Printing Office, Washington, D.C. 20402.

Regulatory Announcement (1941-)

Informational pamphlets containing the text of current regulations. Only fishery Regulatory Announcements have been listed. Announcements and amendments to current regulations are issued throughout the year.

Research Report (1941-)

Technical papers reporting the results of scientific investigations with emphasis on

their practical application. Included are biological, technological, and economic subjects. These succeeded the Investigational Reports series (1931-39) and a former wildlife research series. They are for sale by the Superintendent of Documents, U.S. Government Printing Office, Washington, D.C. 20402, but are distributed free to libraries and a limited number of cooperators.

Separate (1942-)

Reprints of feature (authored) articles from the Bureau of Commercial Fisheries' monthly journal, "Commercial Fisheries Review." Available Separates may be obtained without charge from the Bureau of Commercial Fisheries, U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, Washington, D.C. 20240.

Special Scientific Report--Fisheries (1949-)

Preliminary or progress reports and reports on scientific investigations of restricted scope. Established as Special Scientific Reports in 1940, Nos. 1 to 67 were issued from that date to 1949, when the new series, Special Scientific Report--Fisheries, with new serial numbering, was started. They are distributed free to scientists, libraries, Federal and State agencies, and U.S. and foreign research institutions.

Statistical Digest (1942-)

Annual statistics with detailed tabulations relating to fishery production, manufacture, and commerce. These succeeded the Administrative Report series (1931-40). Digests are for sale by the Superintendent of Documents, U.S. Government Printing Office, Washington, D.C. 20402; some are distributed free to a limited mailing list.

Test Kitchen Series (1950-)

Information on buying, preparing, and cooking fish and shellfish, with tested recipes for institutions, home economists, and homemakers. This series is used to promote the use of fish and shellfish. They are distributed free by the Bureau of Commercial Fisheries.

The Progressive Fish-Culturist (1934-)

A periodical containing articles for fishery biologists and fish culturists. The periodical was issued monthly from 1934 through 1938 and bimonthly from 1939 through 1941; its publication was suspended from 1941 through 1946; it has been a quarterly since 1947. Many depository libraries receive it.

Publication Distribution

Some printed publications of the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service are sold by the Superintendent of Documents, U.S. Government Printing Office, Washington, D.C. 20402. For such sales documents purchase orders should be sent direct to that Office (never to the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service); remittances may be by money order, check, or cash.

Most publications that are issued by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service are distributed free to libraries that have been designated depository libraries for Government publications; a list of depository libraries may be obtained from the Superintendent of Documents, U.S. Government Printing Office.
